## "This time in history"

#### Holland Club/Commodore History MSP Base

This is the first edition of a new feature to the Deep Dive News E edition. "This time in history". It will chronicle the history of the base and district from 1994 until the early 2000's. This was the time that the base and district grew the fastest. All the information that we will use will come from the American Submariner, "Checking in with the bases" and the Deep Dive News. If you like what you see please let us know.

Friday April 5<sup>th</sup> 2019 will be our 16<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the Holland Club/Commodore's breakfast. We feel it is fitting that the first segment on this journey should be the history of the Holland club, both nationally and locally.

#### **HOLLAND CLUB HISTORY NATIONALLY**

The following information was compiled by Bill Britt Holland Club commander written February 22, 2001 and revised 2012.

To the best of our knowledge and from information supplied from shipmates the Holland Club concept was originally proposed by Charlie Marin, San Diego Base and Past National Commander 1994-1996.

The Holland Club was established in May 1994 and was adopted as part of the Constitution and bylaws that year.

The original Holland Club membership card was a paper membership card with the words "Holland Club" stamped on it. Later, about 1995 a newly designed card was introduced. This was a plastic card with the USSVI emblem and the words Holland Club and the members name embossed on it.

In 1996 the Perch Base submitted a Holland Club Patch Designed by Frank Rumbaugh, of the Perch Base, denoting the 50 years of service. This patch along with a Holland Club Membership card and Certificate is now presented to new Holland Club members.

The requirements for membership is the same as originally adopted until 1998 when a change was voted to allow Sub Vets WWII members who had been members in good standing for at least one year the opportunity to become Holland Club members.

The first information I found concerning Holland Club was in the American Submariner January/March 1996 issue where I found a Holland Club membership roster containing 68 names. To my knowledge these were the original plank owners and our commissioning crew.

This list identifies our first Holland Club Commander Leroy Hoppe Thresher base, who qualified on USS S-39 in 1925. The earliest qualification date listed is Frank Phillips New Jersey South base, he qualified on USS L-2 SS-41 in 1917, Joe Dawson New Jersey Base, qualified on USS S-4 SS-109 in 1927, and G Valentine Brown San Diego Base, qualified on USS O-10 SS-67 in 1928.

#### HOLLAND CLUB-COMMODORES HISTORY MINNEAPOLIS ST. PAUL BASE

The following information was compiled from research done from looking back on past issues of the *American Submariner* from June 1995 to December 1999, and The *Deep Dive News* from 1995 until 2003, also Minneapolis/St. Paul base history.

The Minneapolis/St. Paul base received its charter on May 22, 1993. Of the 21 charter members to the base we can only find two members that were eligible for membership to the Holland Club in May 1994. Those members were Burt Block, Bert qualified on the USS Pollock SS-180 in 1941 and Robert Pulis, who qualified on the USS S-32 in 1942. There might be other charter members that were eligible for the Holland Club but we could not find the documentation to support that.

In the spring of each year, starting in 2003, the base hosts a "Navy Style" Breakfast to induct new members of the "Holland Club" as they celebrate the fiftieth year of being qualified as a submariner. There is also an "Order of Ancient Submariners", locally initiated, that recognizes all members, both regular and associate, that have attained the age of 75 years. They are known as "Commodores", *The order of the Ancient Submariner* and are granted paid-up Base life membership.

The last update to the Commodores certificate was done in 2012 by Bob Ehr and Steve Marquis. Bob and Steve added some features to the already existing document, such as color and a dolphin watermark. The dolphin watermark would be silver for enlisted and gold for officers.

## This article appeared in "The Deep Dive News", May/June 2003. Minneapolis/St. Paul base first Holland Club Breakfast.

There were about 32 people in attendance at the Holland Club breakfast. It appeared that they all enjoyed a breakfast of old-fashioned SOS, hard boiled eggs, cornbread, fresh fruit and coffee. George St. Martin, Pat Lyon, Andy Anderson, and Rolly Conklin were the "Mess Cooks" and helped serve the breakfast. Ten of the base members of the Holland Club were also inducted as "Commodores" into the "Order of the Ancient Submariner". The certificates that were presented were created by and a gift to the base by Art Randall, Central Regional Director, USSVI. Art came all the way from St. Louis Missouri for the breakfast and said he would have gone even further for good old-fashioned SOS. The "Holland Club" and

"Ancient Submariner" inductees 2003 were, Bob Pulis, Pat O'Grady, Jerry Anderson, Joe Orbeck, Bernie Conner, Darrell Nelson, Carl Gronemann, Burt Block, Beef Carlson, and Pete Koegel.

Next year, again on the Submarine Service Birthday another class will be inducted into the order. We plan to make this an annual base event.
