


Summer Picnic

These **driving instructions** are premised on how to find the site from a starting point of Exit number 123 of I-35E. From that point go East to Hugo and then North on 61 about 2.5 miles north to 170th street which may be marked as CR 4. On 170th St, drive east about 4.9 miles to Manning Trail this may be marked as either CR 5 or 15. Go North on Manning for 1 mile and turn right on 180th which is a gravel road that is the driveway to the site. This is for people that have never been here before and don't have GPS installed in their chariot.
